

AWARD NOMINATION FOR “BLOOPER”

What is the award?

The “Blooper” Award is made to recognize a humorous, embarrassing, or ironic occurrence to a member of the School. This is a “light-hearted” (“light-headed?”), good-natured award designed to entertain members of the School at the expense of some unfortunate soul.

Who can be nominated?

Candidates can be any student, staff or faculty of the School of Natural Resources who has done or said something they wish they hadn't; for example, coming to school with mismatched shoes, or some field trip fiasco.

Who can nominate?

Nominations may be made by any student, faculty, or staff in the School of Natural Resources. For assistance with nominations, see the current chair of the SNR Awards Committee

Information to be submitted with the nominating petition:

It is incumbent on the nominator to provide the documentation on the petition.

Information recommended is:

1. Name of nominee.
2. Nominating petition describing the event, situation or statements made by the candidate that warrant re-telling and School-wide recognition. Be sure to include sufficient detail to make clear the exceptional level of “boneheadedness,” irony or humor involved.
3. Nominees can be recognized for a long history of bumbling or for a single outstanding event.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

An Award Committee composed of student, faculty, and staff representatives has been appointed by the School Director. The committee will select the award recipient based on the nomination petitions submitted to the Business Manager. It is possible this award will not be presented annually.
