

AWARD NOMINATION FOR OUTSTANDING COURSE

What is the award?

The Outstanding Course Award recognizes a course that is deemed excellent based on its being current, comprehensive and/or broadly based (from theory to application), relevant across disciplines if appropriate, challenging, well-taught, and highly regarded by both faculty and students.

What can be nominated?

Any undergraduate or graduate course, colloquium, seminar or independent study taught in calendar year 2007 and carrying an SNR home label.

Who can nominate?

Any student, faculty member, or staff member in the School of Natural Resources can submit a nomination, though special emphasis will be given to student nominations for this award. For assistance with nominations, see the current chair of the SNR Awards Committee

Information to be submitted with the nominating petition:

It is incumbent on the nominator to provide the documentation on the petition. Information recommended is:

1. Title and number of the course, number of units, cross-listings, and name of instructor(s).
2. A narrative statement on the petition describing the qualities of the course which qualify it for this award.
3. Additional materials, such as other supporters (those familiar with the course) would be appropriate.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

An Award Committee composed of student, faculty, and staff representatives has been appointed by the School Director. The committee will select the award recipient based on the nomination petitions submitted to the Business Manager. It is possible this award will not be presented annually.
