

AWARD NOMINATION FOR PUBLIC SERVICE

What is the award?

The Public Service Award is made to recognize individuals who have provided outstanding public service through professional contributions that go well beyond university-related responsibilities. The individual's public service activities should reflect the School's commitment to addressing contemporary natural resource issues with scholarly rigor and enthusiasm.

Who can be nominated?

Any student, faculty, or staff in the School of Natural Resources.

Who can nominate?

Nominations of candidates for the School of Natural Resources Public Service Award may be made by any students, faculty, or staff in the School. For assistance with nominations, see the current chair of the SNR Awards Committee

Information to be submitted with the nominating petition: It is incumbent on the nominator to do a particularly careful and thorough job of documenting the petition. Information recommended is:

1. Name of nominee.
2. Signed petition of the individual's contributions in any or all of the following:
 - a. technical assistance
 - b. participation in committee and community activities
 - c. development of public educational materials with public or professional impact
3. Supporters' names should include persons knowledgeable of the candidate's contributions, publications, reporting activities of the candidate (including news media), or documents developed in the course of public service activities.

SELECTION PROCEDURE

An Award Committee, composed of student, faculty, and staff representatives, has been appointed by the School Director. The committee will select the award recipient based on nomination petitions submitted to the Business Manager. It is possible this award will not be presented annually.
